International perspective

The Faculty of Law warmly welcomes a large number of international students throughout the academic year. Notably, our institution actively engages in Erasmus exchanges with numerous European partners, fostering rich cross-cultural experiences. The Themis program also provides an exclusive opportunity for the top-performing students to participate in a global network connecting with peers from European as well as Asian universities, more particularly in European and International Law.

→ Studying abroad

In addition to hosting international students, our current students are strongly encouraged to seize the opportunity to broaden their horizons by applying to Erasmus or Themis programs. These initiatives allow students to study abroad for one or two semesters, and the extensive network of partnerships ensures that the diverse preferences and aspirations of our students can be met.

Multilingual learning environment

Students can choose to attend classes in either French or English, although it's worth noting that a relatively high portion of courses, especially in programs such as European law, International law, and Comparative law, are conducted in English.

Within the Master's track in European law, students can select from various curricula, opting for a specialization in either European or International law.

Besides, the Master's track in English and American law offers a wide selection of courses focusing on these legal systems as well as international and comparative law courses.

→ Looking to the future and Global recognition

Looking ahead, the Law faculty is actively developing a dedicated program in International and European law aimed at enhacing UPEC's reputation in these fields and boost the number of graduates in International, European and/or Comparative law. To enrich the academic experience, the Faculty of Law regularly hosts foreign professors who teach seminars in both French and English, open to all students.

The «Jean Monnet» and «International Lawyer» paths of excellence are focused on international perspectives. Students study European law, International law, and Comparative law, with a focus on European and international relations.

→ Faculty Members

Several faculty members have had the opportunity to pursue studies abroad. Three of them completed their theses at the European University Institute in Florence, including the Dean of the Faculty. Others have studied in the United Kingdom or the United States.

The Faculty of Law is an architectural masterpiece designed by Michel Rémon, honored with the Medal of Honor from the Academy of Architecture in 2008. 
